Call to order and approval of the June 19, 2018 meeting minutes.

Governor Deal called the meeting of the State Properties Commission to order and stated the first order of business would be approval of the minutes of the June 19, 2018 meeting. Steve McCoy made a motion to approve the minutes and Alan Skelton seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Approval of the acceptance of the bid by 30 Spring St. (Atlanta) Fee Owner, LLC of \$15,000,000 received through the State's competitive bid process for state-owned property, commonly referred to as "The Gulch", in custody of the State Properties Commission and located in Fulton County. (SPC # 406.74)

Frank Smith presented the request to approve the acceptance of the bid by 30 Spring Street (Atlanta) Fee Owner, LLC of \$15 million for the State owned property known as the Gulch and to delegate to the Executive Director the ability to take any actions necessary in the best interests of the State in order to convey the Gulch Tracts and any additional property interests in accordance with the Gulch Option. Resolution Act 448 of the 2018 General Assembly authorized the conveyance of the state-owned real property interests within a boundary known as the Gulch Boundary Area. State Properties Commission staff issued an invitation to bid on June 21st of this year. The invitation to bid specifically identified two tracts consisting of 0.467 of an acre fee simple and approximately 8.9 acres of air rights. Both tracts are encumbered by separate leases.

Additionally, the ITB provided an option for the successful bidder to acquire other State real property rights remaining in the Gulch Boundary Area for the appraised fair market value as determined by SPC. No property related to the State's Western and Atlantic Railroad is being considered for conveyance. The bid from 30 Spring Street (Atlanta) Fee Owner, LLC was the only bid received and the \$15 million bid is within appraised values.

Alan Skelton motioned to approve the request and Steve McCoy seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Adjournment

Governor Deal requested a motion for adjournment. So moved by Steve McCoy and seconded by Alan Skelton. Meeting adjourned.
